The current planning for the Autonomous Rapid Transit (ART) system has two lines; one ends in Serian while another one in Kampung Rembus, Kota Samarahan. According to Premier Datuk Patinggi Tan Sri Abang Johari Tun Openg, Gedong seems to be the 'missing link' between the two lines — thus, the government is looking into having the ART pass through Gedong as well. This will ensure that Sarawak's food baskets are connected by dual carriageway.
